I've been looked on before as a white man, a white kid, a scad kid, a dork, long hair, bearded druggie, and probably a million other visual stereotypes, but I never felt as strongly separated as walking through forsyth that first day. I do put a lot of thought into issues based around ethnicity, race, segregation and general ignorance, and I've always felt more comfortable living in places that were diverse versus places that are mostly homogeneous. Germany and Japan felt strange to me, and not just because I was the odd one out.

On the first day, I received many hateful stares from people of color, weird looks from scad students mixed with giggles, and warm smiles from some businessmen... which was just as creepy.

As I've gotten dirtier, reactions have changed, of course. Receptionists look on me with disdain, working class people seem to make no judgment, homeless people either greet me happily or actually avoid me as if I was going to ask them for money.

Generally, my interactions with people I know have not changed. For the most part, the second I actually make contact with a person instead of being observed as an other, my interactions normalize.
